We too are easily distracted by the physical world; any discomfort or inconvenience and we grumble easily. These days, it is getting hotter and hotter and the weather is erratic. Floods, droughts, storms are occurring with greater frequency and intensity. We complain, forgetting that we have caused global heating and therefore, its impacts. A future where we complain like the Israelites is a likely reality with worsening climate change.

If human beings have broken the rules of nature and violated the covenant of caring for the Earth, should we complain when we suffer the consequences of our actions? Nature is not "fighting back" as a human being might do. The physical world has rules which we have broken and we are simply reaping what we have sowed while failing to take accountability for it.

The Israelites repented and turned back to God who forgave them. If we don't want a catastrophic future for current and future generations of life on Earth, are we willing to humble ourselves? "If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land (2 Chronicles 7:14)".

The Gospel reading tells us that God sent His only Son "so that through Him, the world might be saved". We need to be saved from our blindness to the current climate emergency of the world which is at a tipping point in history. Only through our repentance in word and deed can we, with God's grace, turn the tide; bring healing, hope, peace and regeneration for people and planet. •



The KL Archdiocese Mission New Evangelization for Christ (AMNEC) is collaborating with the Church of St. Theresa to host a celebration.

2nd round of Influenza Vaccine for Malaysians and free measles rubella (MR) inoculation for Malaysians and foreigners.

As part of their ongoing programme, the District Health Office of Hulu Langat will be conducting a "clinic" with the purpose of giving free influenza vaccines to those above 60 years of age for Malaysians only (with at least one comorbid - diabetes melitus, hypertension, high cholesterol, chronic kidney disease, chronic lung disease - asthma, COPD, chronic heart disease and obesity with BMI > 30).

They'll be also giving free measles rubella inoculations to children (foreigners included) within the ages of 6 months to 59 months. Children born on August 1st 2020 to January 31st 2025 are eligible for this exercise. This exercise will be conducted at the following:-


